This day is designed specifically to support Dakota County area high school students (10th grade through age 21) who have Individual Education Plans (IEPs) to visualize and make plans for their early adult lives beyond school. Student groups will rotate through the below series of activities with support from teachers and other chaperones.

Reality Store

The Reality Store consists of a variety of interactive activities at 14 booths to see firsthand the impacts of career choices on economic well-being, and vice versa. They will make decisions about basic necessities, entertainment, health care, etc. based on the funds available to them depending on their assigned income and family situation. It is an incredibly fun way to learn about serious things.

Resource Fair

Students will have the opportunity to visit exhibitor booths that provide information and resources to support young adults with disabilities throughout Dakota County.

DCTC Tour

Students will tour some of the hands-on learning programs of Dakota County Technical College (DCTC) and learn about supports available to students with disabilities.
