Departments attending:

Child Services

- **Child Support** helps parents in areas such as paternity, court orders for child support and collection and enforcing court orders.
- **Foster Care & Adoption** supports people who wish to foster or adopt a child.
- **Family Home Visiting** offers support services for parents including help adjusting to new babies, help finding family resources and more.
- **Women Infants and Children (WIC)** is a nutrition and breastfeeding program that serves pregnant women, new mothers, babies and young children.

Healthcare

- **Baby Tracks** is a free program that helps keep track of the immunizations your babies need, answers questions about child immunizations, and even has a free immunization clinic.
- **Child & Teen Check Up** helps connect people 21 and younger who receive healthcare benefits through Medical Assistance with health services.

- **Hennepin Health** gives health care coverage to residents enrolled in a Minnesota health care program.

Legal

- **Adult Representation Services** helps people experiencing poverty with legal representation in certain civil areas such as housing, immigration and child support contempt.
- **Hennepin County Law Library** staff can answer legal questions, make referrals to agencies to help answer legal questions and give advice, and more. The Law Library also has public computers.

Library Services

- **Hennepin County Libraries** offer much more than thousands of books to read! Services include mailing library materials to homebound people, tutoring--both online and in person for children in K – 12 and adult learners, arts and culture events, resources for job search and small business development, computers and technology and more.
